

LIFE IN HAITI

- Haiti is the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere
- Most Haitian parents cannot afford to feed, clothe, or send their children to school, let alone seek medical care for injuries and illnesses
- **60%** of Haitians lack access to basic healthcare
- **80%** of Haitians lack improved sanitation facilities
- **58%** of Haitians live below the poverty line, existing on \$2.42 or less each day
- **64 years old** is the life expectancy in Haiti, compared to 80 in the U.S.
- The lack of access to clean water, sanitation, food, and basic healthcare claims most lives in Haiti

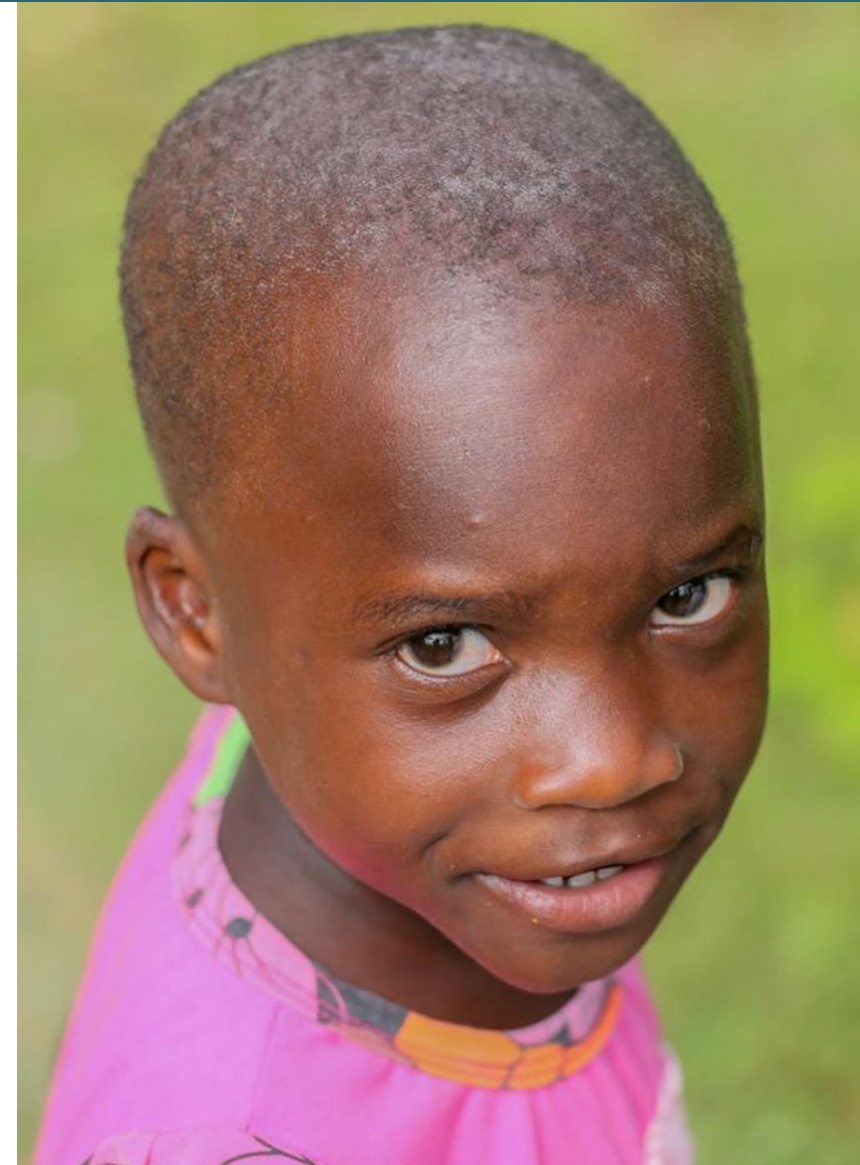

THE FOTCOH CLINIC

Providing weekly medical care for the community at our 6,000-square-foot, solar-powered clinic in Cyvadier, Haiti. Facilities include an exam room, a dental area, and a pharmacy. Tanks on the roof supply potable water and hot water for the showers and kitchen.



WASH PROGRAM

(Water, Sanitation, & Hygiene)

Educating children and families and distributing water filters.



VITAL HEALTH CLINICS & URGENT CARE

Year-round, our providers treat hypertension, diabetes, asthma, severe skin infections, burn injuries, scabies, and other injuries.



FOTCOH also provides surgery, dental care, women's health and breastfeeding education, and immunizations.
